
Geographical Location

Janthum is a small primitive village situated within the jurisdiction of Kamalpur Sub – Division under Dhalai District, Tripura. The distance from the District Head Quarter to Janthum is approximately 27 Km. The literal meaning of Janthum is 'Jan' means 'night' and 'Thum' means 'Three which means 'Three nights'. It is found and said that people who have visited this particular place are attracted to stay here for three days. Janthum English Medium High School is located in this village occupying an area of Janthum approximately 20sq.km.

Janthum English Medium High School is located in a pollution free, eco friendly environment and pleasant weather. The in-habituated around the campus are the HALAM COMMUNITY. The people still practice virgin and transparent culture in the Society.

In fact, literacy is the backbone of progressive and the heartbeat of a developing society. A literate society is free from any kind of slavery and open to varied arenas of progress. But to remove the scourges of literacy is a tough mission. To convert this tough mission in to an achievable one, the Janthum Rural Development Society (JRDS) has taken up the mission. It aims at imparting functional literacy. In fact, the region is a paradise in its unique way, if you have not yet come here, you miss the paradise.

Brief History of School Establishments (JEMS)

A brief notes on the development and growth of the Janthum Bong Colony Area (Janthum English Medium School) JEMS.

Background:

Janthum area inhabited by the Halam's Debbarmas, Bengali's and Meitei's. In the year of 1975 the Bong Halams were converted into the Christianity. Many Short term missionaries are working and stayed some years and had left because they are not permanent staff. In 1989 Miss. Florence Lalparmawi Ralsun Churachanpur, Manipur was appointed by the Evangelical Free Church of India(EFCI)Executive Council on its 41st sitting dated Sielmat 15/08/1989 offered the post of Headmistress EFCI M.E. school Janthum, Tripura.

Although there is no school building, no staff, I just started my school in verandas with 30 students. There is no black-board, no chair; the ground itself is our black-board and chair/table. All the students were studied as nursery level.

I encourage myself and the community to construct a school at least cacha house, thatched roof and bamboo wall; all the parents also agreed and start working very enthusiastically.

In 1990 I made a class arrangement who are little advance in age were promoted into class-I, II and III The students were increasing year by year; I am not able to look after the works so, I wrote a letter to my younger brother Mr. Lalrawngbawl Ralsun, who is a science background. He came down from Manipur to Janthum to help me in the school, not only that, I pay a visit to my home town-Rengkai, churachandpur, share the need and request them to help me in my mission, As a volunteer Mr. Lalsiemvel Pudaite (Present District Superintendent EFCI) and Miss. Elizabeth Lalthienghlim (Present project co-ordinator, Health Dept Govt of Manipur). Responded and came to assist me and they are self sponsor. And From EFCI church three missionaries namely (L). Evan. Lalsonglien Sanate, Evan. Lallungruol Thiek, Evan. Rebeck Lalringzo; etc. were sent to assist me in the school and the church planting.

I. With World Vision:

Since 1990 the World Vision of India would like to work together in partnership with the Mission, so with the agreement between our mission agency and WVI, and then I was appointed for the post of project Manager of Janthum Community Development Project (JCDP) and to help me this new project, four Staff namely, Mr. Lallungawi Amo, Accountant, Mr. J.C. Lalhmangai Joute, Social worker, Mr. (L). Danbabu Halam, Health worker Mr. Rosiemkam Thiek were recruited.

Through this project we received great blessing spiritually and physically. We could provide text books, Exercise note books, pens, uniforms and paying their school fees Rs.10/per student. And the little amount we collected school fees is utilize to employ two graduates teacher on contact basis. I will say we hardly manage. To run a school is not an easy task. I faced many difficulties and problems in my mission works, but God is very faithful and He never left me in vain.

II. With the Community People:

Secondly, I should not forget/Missed out the community people who are standing side by side because of their dedication and sacrificial service JEMS is in this position. To develop our people some hindrances and difficulties we face together, because of that we can stand in this platform

III. Recognition of Janthum English Medium School:

With much difficulties and hardship in pursuing to get the school recognition, God has answer our prayer and in the year 1995 we received the long awaited School recognition from the Government of Tripura under School Education Department, up to class -VIII S.B. School, and later on we received a recognition of High School many students from this school they passed with a flying colours.

IV. Registration of Society Act-1860:

In the midst of hardship and difficulties, we run the School a new day has dawn for us I am grateful to God and happy to receive the certificate of the registration of society act 1860 on 22nd November 1996 from the Government of Tripura. A new dimension and new direction was poured down on me; responsibility and task was arisen for the development onward movement among the Halam tribes.

Activities:

1. Road Link

To establish a School we need many things to restructure and implement in the community. Firstly-Proper roads is required, road connection village to village was constructed for School going children and the community. The World Vision of India has done a tremendous works for the needy places. The Government of Tripura also done a great project we can have a pucca road link till the School premises. Many students from different parts of Tripura came to get good education, a part of the local people these are the tribes who came and studied like Molsom, Kaipeng, Hmar, Debbarma, Koloi, Jamatia, Hrangkhawl, Darlong, Lushai, etc

2. Electricity in Janthum Bong Colony: While I was entering the village, there is no electric connection to the village, only post was lying it was barren. I pay visit the SDO of Electric department in Kamalpur. He was a very kind person and man of action. He promised me before Christmas. A Christmas present for the Community, His promising words are not in vain.

3. Drinking water : There are no sources of water, cacha ring well near the paddy land digging a small hole fetching by the women with a basket, the community took baths, washing, cleaning utensils at the same place... Health and Sanitation also very poor, many women and children's were very sickly because of water problem. The World Vision of India (JCDP) took keen interest and constructs a mini water tank in every village. It helps a lot in the area of health and sanitation. Now the Government of Tripura provides a water supply to every home and point also being made.

Some Vital information of JEMS:

The Janthum English Medium School is established in 1989 It is a Christian Education Institution run by EFCI Missionaries. It is based on the fear of God and convictions, perfection of faults and correction.

- 1. Motto: "So that man of God may be well-fitted and adequately equipped for all good works." (Il Timothy 3:17) (Truth, Love & Service).
- 2. There is a private hostel which is called by name 'Mawipui Hostel'. 'Mawi' means beautiful/pretty, 'Pui' means great or glorious. A beautiful stone was curved and erected in front of the school, for this Hostel theme "Jehovah Jireh" (In Greek) means "God will provide) Provision will follow my best wishes and prayer will never fail; because He is a provider.
- 3. **Discipline**: It is a basic ingredient of disciplines. One who can't himself or herself can't be discipline and can't lead others. A discipline person not only helps himself but help others also.

4. School hand Book

While we are started a school and Hostel we felt the need of School Hand Book, we published a small hand book can cover all the rules and regulations and 52 Devotional songs also attached.

Since then the Christianity has gradually grown into its present shape with a new spacious thoughts and new ideas became larger and larger from different departments as well as good advices from friends was adopted. I could learn a lot of things which I never knew, slowly and gradually it became success.

The month and the year goes like water and running very fast. The things which I expected are not for only one day, my minds roaming here and there thinking for the future. The full settlement or (the school stable) independently can stand on her feet. One day my hardships and difficulties will overcome.

My students will declare who is our Saviour? Who is our School Founder, How she loves us, can they say? A new leader will come up and forget me!!! or after my last breath will they have like my vision?

To make a man is not easy. From my deep heart something strikes on me and new ideas and thoughts come from the bottom of my hearts and Jot down into paper for the JEMS songs.

My best wishes and prayer goes like this -

Like a tender child I was brought up here,
 Let the beauty and famous should spread out,
 How difficult and painful to tolerate in my life.

Up-Gradation of High School (JEMS)

The Janthum English Medium High School (JEMS) was established in the year 1989 AD, led by Mrs. Florence Lalparmoi of Manipur, who had been posted in the village (Janthum Bong Colony) as a missionary in mentioned year under the denomination of Evangelical Free Church of India (EFCI). She took all sort of strategies for bringing development in the school. She also formed school managing committee, they were 1. Late Upa Atien Halam Halam 3. Late. Dailaingul Halam 4.Pu. Asiek Halam 5. Upa. Zongneijoy Halam 7. Pu. Akhup Halam. These were the first managing committee Upa. Thlangthangluoi & members of the school (JEMS). All these members were God fearing people and were very faithful in their works. They never take any decision without a prayer. They all gave full support and co-operation with Mrs. Lalparmoi in bringing development of the school. Besides that, they also gave their own time & labours according to the need of the school. On the other hand, Mrs. Florence L parmoi continue to keep a net-working with the Govt. schemes and facilities. She also formed Janthum Bong Colony Rural Development Society. In the year 1996 AD the school was recognized up to standard VIII (eight) (senior school) under Directorate of School Education Govt. of Tripura.

Mrs. Lalparmoi was transfer from this School, no eligible/faithful Headmaster/Headmistress was posted in the school. But the local people were demanding a good school. Knowing the crucial need of the people in the area Janthum Bong Colony Rural Development Society (JRDS) was bound to take up full responsibility of school administrative power. Meanwhile, the World Vision of India has played an important role for bringing development in the school as well as in the society, Mr. Jimmy Hrangate (CDC WVI) & his brother Albert Hrangate (Ex-Headmaster JEMS), who had been working with us as a Headmaster for about 7 (seven) years. He too gave his full strength and support in bringing development in the school. As a result gradually the school started developing and progressing overtime.

With the constant public demand & interest we have been giving proposal to the Director of school Education for Up-Gradation up to high school standard since 2008, at that year we had already enrolled class- IX (Nine) students. We went to different Govt. offices like District Education Office, I/S office & Director of Education offices regarding up-gradation purpose. We know that, Government official rule is very strict and there is criteria you must fulfil it otherwise you will be rejected. To get any Govt. facility, it has to be scrutinized & examine before issuing & sanctioning. So, for that reason it took long time for Board Registration while class IX (nine) students & guardians were already seeking Board Registration Card. In 2009, class IX students were promoted to class X (ten) standard without any Board Registration Card, those days were our critical periods. But, the school was setup for the kingdom of God's glory & on the Foundation Stone it was written "JEHOVAH ZIRE" (which means "On the mountain of the Lord it will be provided") Other member does not know much, how critical it was to get up-

gradation of the school. Class X (ten) students are about to appear their Metric Selection Test Exam under Tripura Board of Secondary Education (TBSE) without any registration. I too became exhausted & helpless running to the Government offices often to get up-gradation. Finally I am bound to bow on my feet & pray to the Almighty God on the 10/06/2009 in the corner of the school field it was about 7:00 PM evening. I prayed earnestly and asked Him "The school is setup for Your Kingdom and for the Glory of Your Name. But, why are You yet keeping Silent? What will be the students' future?" The miracle of God knocked me that very moment, (Psalm 1:3) "He shall be like a tree planted by the river of water, that brings forth its fruit in its season. Whose leaf also shall not wither and whatever he does shall prosper." My tears felt with joy and I exclaimed "May Your name be glorify in Heaven and earth." I gave thanks unto Him for listening my prayer that very moment. Next day on 11/06/2009, I went and approach to our local MLA Hon'ble Sri. Sudhir Das at Manik Bhandar along with all the proposal file and documents regarding the school up-gradation matters, There and then, he quickly call the Director of School Education by his telephone in present of me, right after that the director gave us green signal for the possibility of up-gradation through his communication. The next morning on 12/06/2009, I went to the Director office at Agartala along with all the official documents, after I met the director, he did not ask/enquire me anything regarding the matter. I just handed the proposal file to him, again there and then he ordered to his clerk to prepare up-gradation letter. Within an hour I received the up-gradation letter. Those days were my ever joyful and memorable day.



OBJECTIVES OF THE SCHOOL:

- To ensure that students attain a reasonable level of competency in three languages as envisaged in three languages formula.
- To serve for improvement of quality of school education in general through sharing of experiences and facilities.
- The medium of instruction is English while Bengali/Lushai is taught as second language.



Guidelines under Section 35 (1) of the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education (RTE) Act, 2009 for Implementation of Clause (c) of Sections 8 and 9 of the RTE Act

Clause (c) of sections 8 and 9 of the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education (RTE) Act, 2009 casts a duty on the appropriate Government and local authority to ensure that the child belonging to weaker section and the child belonging to disadvantaged group are not discriminated against and prevented from pursuing and completing elementary education on any ground. In order to enable State Governments and school managements to fulfil their responsibilities for creating a non-discriminatory school environment, following guidelines are issued for implementation of clause (c) of section 8 and 9 of the RTE Act:

- 1. Every school referred to in clause (n) of section 2 of the RTE Act shall take appropriate measures to:
 - 1. a) Safeguard the interests of the child belonging to weaker section and disadvantaged group.
 - 2. b) Eliminate discrimination or harassment of a child belonging to disadvantaged group or weaker section in schools by prohibiting it and by providing for preventive and protective measures to facilitate its eradication.
 - 3. c) Promote equality for children belonging to weaker section and disadvantaged group.
- 2. A school shall not discriminate a child belonging to the weaker section or disadvantaged group, allow or condone any constituent of the school to discriminate such a child or a group of such children, and take the following measures, namely:-
 - 1. (a) The school shall not discriminate against a child belonging to weaker section and disadvantaged group in admission or-
 - 1. (i) by breach of the policy of reservation in admissions as may be applicable;
 - 2. (ii) in the way in which an application is processed;
 - 3. (iii) by denying or limiting access to any benefit arising from such enrolment provided by the school;
 - 4. (iv) by treating unfavourably in any way in connection with the child's enrolment to a specific standard of class or area of study, training or instruction.

- 1. (b) The school shall prohibit all persons and authorities of the school from harassing or victimizing any child belong to weaker section and disadvantaged group
- 1. (i) by announcing, verbally or otherwise, in the class, the names of the community or castes or tribes of the students;
- 2. (ii) by labelling such students as reserved category in the class;
- 3. (iii) by passing derogatory remarks indicating social, economic or other background as reason of under-performance in the class;
- 4. (iv) by allotting differential time to such students to meet teacher as compared to other students;
- 5. (v) by treating them separately in utilizing the sports and other facilities.
- (c) The school shall ensure that no child belonging to weaker section or disadvantaged group is discriminated against by segregating such children from others in playground or canteen or any provision of Mid Day Meal, or any other amenities provided by the school including toilets and drinking water facilities, and ensure that -
- 1. (i) regular activities of such children are not disrupted or disturbed by any of its decision;
- 2. (ii) such children do not experience financial extortion or forceful expenditure;
- 3. (iii) all such children are allowed to participate in cultural programmes, sports events, and other activities organized by the school;
- 3. The school shall prescribe the procedures and mechanism to deal with and decide any complaint or discrimination made or submitted by any child belonging to the weaker section or the disadvantaged group, and it shall be obligatory on the part of the school to decide such complaints within a maximum period of 60 days from the date of receipt or submission of such complaint.
- 4. The schools shall take steps to engage with the educational fraternity, the community and the public at large, and raise public awareness on the importance of equality and overcoming discrimination and harassment against children belonging to weaker section and disadvantaged group in schools. The school shall make public all measures taken by it for elimination of discrimination against and harassment of children belonging to weaker section and disadvantaged group.
